This day came J. R. Jones et al a majority of a Jury of review before appointed by this Court to view and mark out a new public road leaving the Columbian Road at the School House in the New old field by J. R. Jones to the road near the swamp running North East from Clinton and present their report in writing stating that they have viewed said marked out road as follows. Leaving the Columbian Road at the said School House in the New old field and running through the Ms Gap of Hayes Mountain and intersecting the Montevallo road at J. R. Jones and leaving the said Montevallo road at the South end of the Gillis old field and running near the Middle of Sections 24-25 and 36 in T 22 R 14 and intersecting near the swamp the road running North East from Lee's Corners. It is therefore ordered by the Court that said Road as marked out be and the same is hereby established a third Grade road. It is further ordered that J. F. Tolley and Isaac Gillison be appointed overseers of the first pucinct from the swamp North of Clinton to the Gillis old field and that Isaac Gillison be appointed overseer of the second pucinct from Montevallo road at J. R. Jones to Columbian road. It is further ordered that the Columbian Road from the School house in New old field to Logans place and Montevallo road from Gillis old field to Logans place

and the Altimontia road from Logans place to Baptist Church at Chestnut street and ~~the~~^{the} ~~old~~^{new} ~~road~~^{road} from town to junction of the Kingston road from town at Mrs Drubis to County line in and the same one hereby discontinued.

This day came J. T. Mullins John H. Nelson and M. D. Peirson a committee heretofore appointed by this Court to let out and contract for the repairing of the bridge across the Chestnut Creek at Nelson's Mill and present their report in writing as follows.

And now comes David L Kelley and presents his petition to the Court his petition in writing praying that a Ferry be may establish a ferry across the Coosa River at the Johnson old Ferry, allying among other things that he is the owner of the Land on the West side of said River and that there is no other ferry within one mile of said Johnson's old Ferry. And it appears to the satisfaction of the Court that the allegations in said petition are true. It is therefore ordered by the Court that the said D. L. Kelley may establish said ferry across said River at the Johnson old Ferry upon entering into bond with good security approved by the Judge of Probate of this County and payable to the County of Butler in the sum of Five hundred Dollars, and conditioned according to ~~Law~~, A. I. the said D. L. Kelley having first with the Judge of Probate of this County his bond to J. J. McPhee and W. E. Coulter as his sureties to remain in the said office bonded to him, and conditioned according to law which bond is deemed good and sufficient. It is also ordered that said Ferry be and the same be so established. It is further ordered that said D. L. Kelley be allowed to charge the following rates of ferrymen: 4 horse team \$5. 2 horse team \$3. 50 cents 1 horse team or mow & horse 25 cents man or woman 10 cents, and he shall be allowed to charge double rates in times of high water.

and Date and Grant witnesseth that the said
Date and grant on this first day of June to plaster with
the good coat of Plaster and Kalsonium the front side
of the Court Room of the Court House of said County in
good style in tints and to seal the same room over head and
to seal on 4 offices in the Court house on the first
Story as follows the two sides will be sealed and the ceiling
of each office and the arches of the Hallway the ceiling
will be done with good ceiling lumber well dressed and
seasoned and tongued and grooved to provide great
mould pieces to each of the five places in the Court
house All the lumber to be well seasoned and the
whole affair done to be done by the first day of
October 1874. And the said Court of County Com-
missioners agree on this first to grant the said Date
and grant for said work will order on the Treasurer

of said County for the sum of four hundred and
fifty four Dollars. They further agree to pay a
Special Tax for the year 1875 to pay said amount
of four hundred and fifty four Dollars
