## Between Chestnut and Yellow Leaf ...

Being an Unauthorized History of The Union Reconstruction Era In Central Alabama

Political, economic, and social ruin—the common consequences of losing a war. As a result of the U. S. Civil War, of all American citizens, only Southerners ever experienced such a loss. And many Southerners who survived the war didn't survive its aftermath: Union Reconstruction. They became pawns of political power brokers (both external and indigenous); most became impoverished; and, the Southern society is *still*—over 150 years later—sorting out some of the pieces of a "new" structure of social relationships.

But some of our ancestors did survive, either by hard work, force of wit and will, or by pure luck. *Between Chestnut and Yellow Leaf*—a new historical-fiction novel written by Colyn Moatts—chronicles the post-war experiences of two families—one family dirt poor, the other quite wealthy—in rural central Alabama. In varying degrees, they did survive Reconstruction (and beyond), but their struggles were exhausting and the price they paid was imposing.

Just in time for the County Sesquicentennial, Colyn will be our guest speaker at the October meeting and will give us a presentation on the background and writing of BC&YL.
