One of the most asked about buildings in Clanton is the old Willingham Hotel. The hotel and its predecessor have held many names over the century of their existence. Below is what I've learned so far.

#### **Early Days**

When Clanton was young, the streets were a bit different than they are today. In 1908, if you travelled south on Eight Street past the Methodist Church, at Second Avenue North you would deadend right into the old hotel. This large, two story, wood frame hotel stood in what is now the middle of Eighth Street. This hotel had 25 rooms and was named the Hotel Elliot. It was likely built between 1900 and 1906.

Though originally named the Hotel Elliot, a few years later, about 1910, a new postcard was published that listed the Hotel as the Palmer Hotel (also sometimes called the Palmer House).

In the August 25, 1910 issue of <u>The Clanton Press</u> there is an article entitled, "Whom I Met in Clanton," by a "roving reporter" named Mary T. Whitson (reprinted in the <u>Chilton County Historical Society Newsletter</u> October, 1984). It is one article in a series documenting her travels through the county. She

states "Clanton has got the best hotel in Alabama, the Hotel Palmer. Mrs. Palmer sets before her guests the most palatable cooking I ever ate. The hotel is in the loveliest place in Clanton. The dining room is always full and the spacious galleries always crowded. She is a gracious landlady."
