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Header	The State of Alabama, Chilton County. Commissioners Court, Regular Term, April 5th A.D. 1880. Present and presiding: Hon. H. J. Callen, Judge of Probate. Commissioners: J. [C.] Wells, D. A. White, Moses Robinson and J. C. Gardner. When the following orders were made and entered in the premises.
Barrett & Brown - \$23.25	It is ordered by the Court that Barrett and Brown be and they are hereby allowed their warrant on the County Treasurer for the sum of twenty-three & 25/100 dollars, for books and blanks furnished W. A. Smith, Tax Assessor.
W. H. Foshee - \$100.00 Book Page 46	It is ordered by the Court that W. H. Foshee, Clerk of the Circuit Court, be and he is hereby allowed his warrant [remainder obscured by covering paper].

S. A. Blasingame - \$35.00	It is ordered by the Court that S. A. Blasingame be and he is hereby allowed his warrant on the County Treasurer for the sum of thirty-five dollars for lumber to repair the bridge across Goose Pond Creek.
Seaborn Jones, Tax Collector - \$60.60	It is ordered by the Court that Seaborn Jones, Tax Collector, be and he is hereby allowed his warrant on the County Treasurer for the sum of sixty and 60/100 for one day books purchased by him for use of the County.

Pauper support - \$5.00 each	It is ordered by the Court that Jake Walker, Edy Hooker, Dock Armstrong, C. W. Mills, Matilda Carlisle, Thomas Cunningham, Ruthy Lee, Mrs. Willie ONeal and C. H. Sheppard be and they are hereby allowed their warrant on the County Treasurer for the sum of five dollars each for their support, 2d quarter 1880.
James Andrews & wife - \$9.00	It is ordered by the Court that James Andrews and wife be and they are hereby allowed their warrant on the County Treasurer for the sum of nine dollars for their support, 2d quarter 1880.
John Kelley - \$9.00	It is ordered by the Court that John Kelley be and he is hereby allowed his warrant on the County Treasurer for the sum of nine dollars for his support, 2d quarter 1880.
E. & N. Norris - \$10.00	It is ordered by the Court that E. & N. Norris be and they are hereby allowed their warrant on the County Treasurer for the sum of ten dollars for their support, 2d quarter 1880.
Ellis & Elizabeth Cobb - \$5.00 Book Page 48	It is ordered by the Court that Ellis & Elizabeth Cobb be and they are hereby allowed their warrant on the County Treasurer for the sum of five dollars for their support, 2d quarter 1880.

B. & M. Dubose - \$25.00	It is ordered by the Court that B. & M. Dubose be and they are hereby allowed their warrant on the County Treasurer for the sum of twenty-five dollars for their support, 2d quarter 1880.
Seaborn Jones, Tax Collector	It is ordered by the Court that when Seaborn Jones, Tax Collector, shall present his lists of errors and insolvencies for the tax year 1879, it is hereby ordered that H. J. Callen, Judge of Probate, be and he is hereby authorized to receive and examine said lists and, if found to be correct, to receive the same and allow said Tax Collector credit for the amount thereof.
Voting place of Beat No. 2	Whereas application has been made to the Court to change the voting place of Beat No. 2 from Providence Church to Clear Creek in Chilton County; and it appearing to the Court that notice of said application has been given for the time prescribed by law, it is therefore ordered by the Court that the voting place of Beat No. 2, to-wit, Providence Church, be changed from its present location to Clear Creek in said County. It is further ordered that said voting place shall be known and called Clear Creek. It is further ordered that all elections to be held, whether special or general, that the voting place of Beat No. 2 shall be at Clear Creek and Jamison in said Beat.
Seaborn Jones - tax errors/insolvencies	Seaborn Jones, Tax Collector of said County, now presents to the Court a list of errors and insolvencies for the tax year 1879 as follows: Insolvencies on property, State, \$8.96; Errors on property, State, \$6.45; Insolvencies on poll tax, \$244.50; Errors on poll tax, \$96.50; and it appearing to the Court that the same is correct as returned by said Tax Collector, it is therefore

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	ordered by the Court that the same be and is hereby allowed and that the Tax Collector be entitled to credit therefor [amounts and county columns partly obscured].

Resolution	Resolved, 2nd, That in his death the County has lost a faithful officer, and one amongst its most useful, faithful, public-hearted, patriotic citizens, and one that filled the trusts committed to his care by his constituency faithfully, fearlessly, but in all things he acted justly, in every sentiment only having in view to know his duty, and perform it.
Resolution	Resolved, 3rd, That a copy of these resolutions be spread on the minutes of this Court on a page inscribed to his memory, and that the Judge of this Court furnish a copy of these resolutions to the family of the late James C. Gardner.
