Shady, J. Martin Henry Cole, James Mitchell, William Farmer, L. Martin, Thomas L. Lethen be and they are hereby appointed a Jury of review to view said Market road and proposed range line road. And that they have notice of their appointment And that they report their action in the premises to the next term of this Court.

"Whereas at a Regular Term of this Court held on the 9th day of August A.D. 1880 And Order was made And entered in the premises to establish a new road leading from a certain point one mile South of the date of Joe Pines on the Adams Ferry Westburg road running in a western direction to again intersect the Adams Ferry Road at or near Eagle Pond Creek near the Corner of Clinton. And Whereas at the term of said Court the following named persons were appointed a Jury of review viz. J. E. Shady, J. M. Sernau, Moses Armstrong, George Myers, James Shacker, Ruben Popwell, Aug. E. K. Loeve Sr. to view and mark out said proposed new road. And the said Jury of review having made their report as required by law stating among other things that they met on the 10th day of September A.D. 1880. And after being sworn proceeded to view and mark out said road And further that said road will be of great utility to the traveling public. It is therefore ordered by the Court that said road be and the same are hereby established in accordance with the route viewed and marked out by said Jury of review.

It is further ordered by the Court that George Means be and he is hereby appointed Overseer in said new road that he is hereby required to open the same in the manner indicated by the blazes of said Jury of review and that he keep the same in repair until his successor shall be appointed and commissioned and that he have notice of this appointment and order of this Court.

Whereas at a Regular Term of this Court held on the 9th day of August 1850 an order was entered in the minutes to establish a new road beginning at the Antwerp County line near N. G. Lawton and ending near J. B. Hardys again intersecting the Kingston and Dixie Road between J. B. Hardys and L. B. McDonough.

And Whereas at said Term of said Court the following named persons were appointed as a Jury of review to view and mark out said road viz. J. M. Means, W. S. Weaver, W. M. Hovey, Sumner Roberts and George Whinner. And the said Jury of review having made their report as required by said Statute among other things that they made on the 15th day of September 1850 and after being sworn foremen to view and mark out said and proposed new road. It is therefore ordered by this Court that said road be and the same is hereby established in accordance with the route viewed and marked out by said Jury of review. It is further ordered by this Court that J. B. Hardy be and he is hereby appointed Overseer on said road from fork near J. B. Hardys to ~~W. S. Weaver~~ ^{W. S. Weaver}. That is hereby required to open the same in the manner indicated by the Jury of review and that he keep the same in repair until his successor shall be appointed and commissioned and that he have notice of this appointment and order of this Court.

Whereas at a regular Term of this Court held on the 9th day of August 1880 and order was entered in the premises to establish a new road leading from Payes Ferry on the Coosa River to intersect the Adams East Ferry road a Board Lewis Church and Wm. At said term of said Court the following named persons was appointed a jury of review to view and mark out said proposed new road viz James F. McKee, J. S. McKee, John Marcus W. Mahan, E. Mahan, J. D. Johnson and the said jury of review having made their report as required by said Statute among other things that they met on the 11th day of September 1880 after being sworn by the Court to view and mark out said proposed new road It was therefore ordered by the Court that said road be and the same be hereby established in accordance with the route viewed and marked out by said jury of review. It is further ordered by the Court that William Marcus Jr. be and he is hereby appointed overseer on said road that he is hereby required to open the same in the manner indicated by the jury of review and that he keep the same in repair until this supersedeas shall be appointed and Commissioned and that he have notice of this appointment and order of this Court.
