April 1885	State of Alabama, Commissioners Court, Chilton County, Special Term April 6th 1885. Present and presiding H. J. Callen Judge of Probate and present Commissioners Anderson Baker Sr, R. C. Lenoir, Moses Roberson and Buckner Harris. When the following orders were made and entered in the premises to wit as follows.
J. T. Smitherman \$90.00	Ordered that J. T. Smitherman be allowed ninety dollars for ex officio and road service and six days attendance on Circuit Court and two days in County Court in March term April.
Wilson & Jefferson \$3.25	And that Wilson & Jefferson be allowed Three 25/100 Dollars serving jail and work for Circuit Court.
Dake & Grant \$4.00	And that Dake and Grant be allowed for work on table Four Dollars.
L. B. Wells & Son \$6.20	And that L. B. Wells and Son be allowed for lumber \$6.20.
W. H. Acree \$1.45	And that W. H. Acree be allowed for lock on desk one 45/100 Dollars.

Jake Fitzpatrick \$5.00	And that Jake Fitzpatrick be allowed for support Five Dollars.
W. E. Stewart \$9.00	And that Dr. W. E. Stewart be allowed for medical services to prisoners and for wood Nine Dollars.
W. H. Foshee \$50.00	And that W. H. Foshee be allowed for ex officio services Fifty Dollars.
H. J. Callen \$72.50	And that H. J. Callen be allowed for ex officio road service Seventy two 50/100 Dollars.
H. J. Callen \$6.00	And that H. J. Callen be allowed for two days Commissioners Court Six Dollars.
H J Callen hire convicts & build jury room	And that H. J. Callen hire the county convict for twelve months to labor at sawmill or on a farm, and that he also be and is hereby authorized to have built for the rise of jury such rooms as he may think best and that he correspond for proposals and plans for a jail.
Appointment No. 4	And that the resignation of S. A. Blasingame as road apportioner for Beat No. 4 be accepted and that C. W. Stanley be appointed to fill said vacancy.
Appointment No. 2	And that resignation of J. J. Moats and Marion Honeycutt as apportioners for Beat No. 2 be accepted and that B. M. Gentry and Jas B. Johnson be appointed as apportioners of Beat No. 2 to fill said vacancy.
Ternan Road	The jury heretofore appointed by this Court to view and mark out a change in the Ternan road, having discharged that duty and report the following change, leaving the Ternan road at the sign post near E. T. Rhodes thence by George Mims and intersect the Montgomery road near C. D. Rutherfords thence across said road and again intersect the Ternan road east Ternanville. It is ordered that said change be accepted and that the Ternan Road shall stand changed to conform to said report.
New road	And that P. E. Harris, P. M. Moore, Crawford Harris, J. T. Jones, W. L. Parnell, Wm Moore, and W. J. Bates be appointed as a jury of review to view and mark out a new public road commencing at south end of Moore Road between Mrs Moores and H. G. Lassiters land thence through Mrs Dushills and W. J. Bates land and intersect the Selma and Montevallo road.
Jack Harris Road	And that Jack Harris, J. J. Bates, A. L. Stokes, D. M. Martin, H. J. Cole, Jasper Friday and Luther Friday be appointed as a jury of review to view and mark out a new public road as follows: leave the Selma road near W. J. Bates thence by Jack Harris, thence best route to and intersect the new market road.
Kingston Road	The jury heretofore appointed by this Court to view and mark out a change in the Kingston Road having discharged their duty and report the following change, leaving the road this side Mrs. Vinson, thence to J. M. Corderie mill and intersect the Clanton and Cooper road. It is therefore ordered that said change in the Kingston be accepted and that part of the Kingston road from near the Mrs Vinson be discontinued.
H J Callen purchase lot	And that H. J. Callen purchase a lot for the use of the county and issue a warrant on Treasurer to pay for same.
Mrs. Bailey Jas Edwards Mrs. Martin Wm Harper Buck Harris	And that Mrs. Bailey, Jas Edwards, Mrs. Martin, Wm Harper and Buck Harris be allowed for support; and that Buck Harris be allowed for one day and mileage as Commissioner; that Moses Roberson be allowed for one day and mileage, and that Anderson Baker be allowed for one day and mileage.
R. C. Lenoir \$3.40	And that R. C. Lenoir be allowed for one days service and mileage as Commissioner Three 40/100 Dollars.
H. J. Callen \$3.40	And that H. J. Callen be allowed Three 40/100 Dollars for articles for use of office.
R. M. Honeycutt	And now comes R. M. Honeycutt Tax Collector of said County and presents to the Court his list of errors and insolvencies in manner and form prescribed by law for tax year 1884 and it appearing from the inspection of said report that he is entitled to the following credits to wit: Recapitulation, errors on real estate, State tax \$29.82, county tax \$13.42; errors on personal property, State tax \$5.33, county tax \$2.43; insolvencies on personal property, State tax \$58.16, county tax \$26.91; totals State tax \$92.81, county tax \$42.76; errors on poll tax \$142.50; insolvencies on poll tax \$421.50; total poll tax \$564.00.
